



# Salzburg College Internship Program

The Salzburg College Internship Programs are combined academic and applied learning programs. During the first block, students are required to take a German language course and "The European Experience" course while participating in special internship preparatory meetings. During the second block, semester program students partake in a part-time internship alongside their third academic course whereas the summer program is engaged in a full-time internship. Prior German knowledge is not required. Salzburg College works closely with qualified students before their arrival and during their first weeks in Salzburg to select an internship placement best fitting each individual student's personal, language, and academic needs.

# Semester Internship Program

Semester Internship students are expected to enroll in three academic courses as well as the internship for a total of 12 U.S. credit hours.

Summer Internship students are expected to enroll in **two** academic courses as well as the internship for a total of 9 U.S. credit hours.
